





## **Equalization** A hard pill to swallow.

This documents edition 1 of 7. Weight (.435Kg) 0.96 lbs. It is 14 inches tall by 9 inches wide and 1 inch thick.

This is made from a single piece of cedar from the Quinte area where I live. Relevant to this work, I did however, live in Calgary for a few years.

This is a political piece. In Canada, there is a governmental process in place currently referred to as equalization. In this process, wealthier provinces have funds reallocated with provinces of lesser good fortune.

Alberta which has prospered from oil resources, and has been a major contributor to these federal equalization payments for some time. In general, since the first Trudeau prime minister, Albertans almost exclusively blame Liberal governments for any downturns in the oil markets. Or anything for that matter.

Minimal sanding was done on this piece, the slightly rough surface finish helps give this piece it's hard done by look.

Staining was applied to the piece. I find a medium tone piece gives a better combination of shadow and highlights.

This part then had some manual clean up, then was variably stained to a This receiving medium, more specifically is two pieces from the same roughed source, and the size of the medium to produce yet another output file. This g-code file is then run on the Leap-id studio CNC router (Hans), a process medium brown to allow a combination of highlights and shadow, then sealed with a water based varathane. This rendered using computer aided design software (CAD), a time-consuming process dependent on complexity and the creative process. This is generally done with a specific cutter size and shape in mind. The renditions are then altered in minor ways to suit the dimensions of the receiving medium, in this case a cedar from the Quinte area. authenticity. The file is then converted to files that can be read by the CAM software which is then manipulated This sculpture was produced in the Leap-id studio by Marc Soublière. These sculptures are first designed and make each sculpture unique. As such a specific edition description accompanies the piece to assure it's sculpture is rough to the touch.
